Understanding the Hybrid PAC

1. What Is a Hybrid PAC?

A Hybrid PAC operates two separate bank accounts: a non-contribution account that may raise unlimited sums from corporations, unions, and individuals for independent expenditures, and a contribution account that may accept only limited amounts from individuals to contribute directly to candidates.

2. How Does a Hybrid PAC Differ From a Traditional PAC?

Traditional political action committees are limited in who can give to them and limited in the amounts they can give to candidates. A Hybrid PAC combines that traditional, limited contribution account with a second, unlimited non-contribution account used only for independent expenditures, never coordinated with candidates or parties.

3. What Are the Benefits of a Hybrid PAC?

The creation of the Better Access to Chiropractic (BAC-PAC) enables the chiropractic profession to increase its political influence with key decision makers in Congress by participating in a number of targeted congressional campaigns.

4. How Can the Chiropractic Profession Benefit From a Hybrid PAC?

BAC-PAC's involvement in key congressional races will strengthen the chiropractic profession's influence on critical legislation, such as Medicare modernization and access to chiropractic care within the military.

5. Purpose and Goals

Purpose: To build political support, allies, and champions to support pro-chiropractic legislation.
